On behalf of students and parents, I'd like to thank each of you for your gifts during the past school year. We count on your generosity as we move into the future.

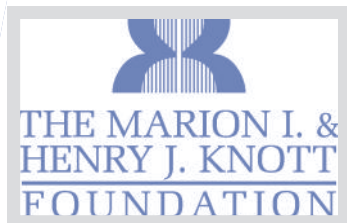

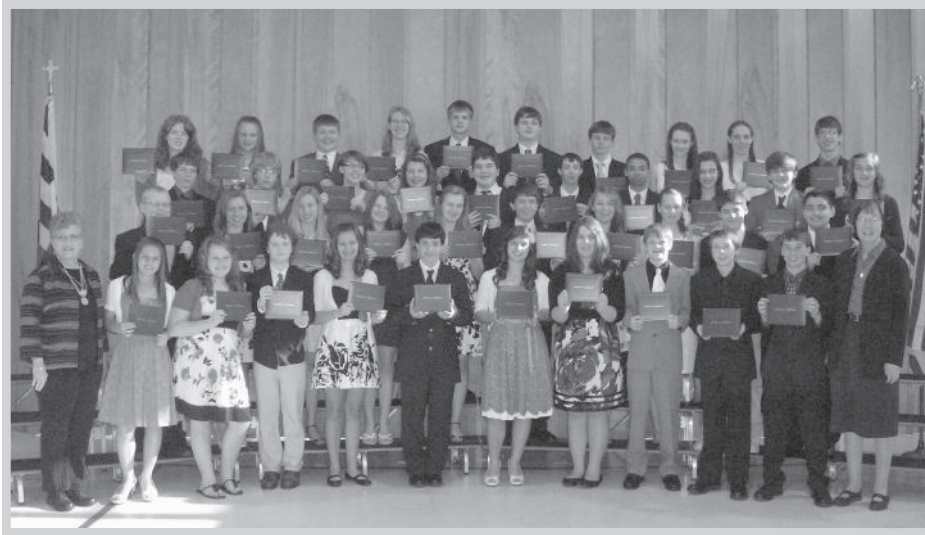

Did you know that children are nearly eight times safer riding in a school bus than with their own parents? (Nat'l Highway Traffic Safety Administration) The vehicle's size, yellow paint, warning devices, special lights, and regulated design characteristics all help. Michael Martin of the Nat'l Association for Pupil Transportation says "the concept is of eggs in a carton." Closely spaced, well anchored, heavily padded, high backed seats absorb impact so that children are cushioned in a crash.

Physical Fitness Recognized



Presidential Award Winners

Physical fitness has always been an important part of the overall development of Mother Seton School (MSS) students. This year, 42 MSS students were awarded the Presidential Physical Fitness Award and 117 students received the National Physical Fitness Award at the end of the annual Field Day.

"I am impressed with the amount of award achievers this year," said Mrs. Danielle Kirby, Physical Education teacher. "55% of the students tested achieved award status in all five components of fitness testing," continued Kirby.

The Presidential Physical Fitness Award Program was started in 1966 by President Johnson and became the President's Challenge in 1986. The Physical Fitness Test recognizes students for their level of physical fitness in five events: curl-ups or partial curl-ups, shuttle run, endurance run/walk, pull-ups or right angle push ups, and V-sit or sit and reach. Presidential Award recognizes students that score at or above the 85th percentile on all five events.

Award Winners Announced

Recent graduates, Travis Stockdale and Ellen Weber were the recipients of the 2010-2011 Mother Seton Spirit Award for Outstanding Christian Witness.

These awards, given to a male and female graduate each year, reward the two students who best demonstrate stellar Christian values during their time at Mother Seton School.

Stockman says he was surprised to win. "I felt really honored because I thought someone else would win it. Still, I do remember Sister JoAnne saying she could always count on me. I always volunteered and spoke at the Masses," said Travis.

Parents Chris and Laura Weber were thrilled with the honor for their daughter, Ellen, "We are very proud of the fine young woman she has become," they

said. The Webers also had complements for all of the graduates. "It is gratifying to see how much the entire 8th grade has grown and matured since kindergarten. We are grateful for the powerful way that Mother Seton School helps all of our students learn and become people of faith and character," they said.

The

Scholars Program combines an emphasis on broadly rooted intellectual curiosity with the belief that Philosophy is the foundation of learning. The Program requires students to enroll in Honors and Advanced Placement courses during their four years, with a Socratic Seminar during their Junior year." **Congratulations Julia.
