PROCEDURES

1. No medication will be administered in school without the parent's (guardian's) authorization and physician's signature.
2. The medication, properly labeled by a pharmacist, must be hand-delivered to the school by the parent. In NO circumstances will either the Health Department or school personnel administer medication brought to school by the pupil.
3. **THE FIRST MEDICATION OF ANY NEW PRESCRIPTION MUST BE STARTED OUTSIDE THE SCHOOL.**
4. The school must have on file in the pupil's health folder a statement from the physician including:
(a) Name of the pupil; (b) Name of the medicine; (c) Dosage and hours to be given during the school day; (d) Expected duration of administration; (e) List of possible side effects, if any. **THE PARENT IS RESPONSIBLE FOR OBTAINING THE PHYSICIAN'S STATEMENT.**
5. The parent is responsible for submitting to the school notification of any change in dosage or time of giving medication in writing from the physician.
6. All medication kept in the school will be kept under lock and key accessible only to authorized administering personnel.
7. The school will not assume responsibility for giving medication not prescribed by a physician.
